

Course Tutorial: tips & tools

Welcome to the tips and tools section. The lessons in this course integrate interactive video presentations and additional resources.


1) When you choose a lesson from the menu, you will be taken to the webpage with the video and resources. The video will automatically start. You can choose to pause the presentation using the "play/pause" button at the bottom of the video screen. You can also rewind a section using the back arrow. (An example of what you will see on each lesson's page is shown below.)

2) Each lesson has some slides with audio clips. If a slide in the lesson has audio, an audio icon will be seen in the lower right corner. This is an indicator that you should hear sound on that particular slide.



3) Each lesson includes interactive pieces. These may be quiz questions, short answers, journal questions, and choices of the topics you want to learn more about. You will be able to use your keyboard or mouse to answer questions or make choices. The presentation will pause on its own, in order for you to participate. It will restart once you have completed the activity. If there are journal questions, you will have the opportunity to e-mail your responses to yourself for future use.

4) To begin the lessons, choose one of the classes in the menu below Part 1 and Part 2.
